2009 AWARDS COMPETITION FOR THE BEST JOURNALISM IN ARIZONA

PHOTOJOURNALISM RULES

ELIGIBILITY

The contest is open to professional journalists. For more details, see our Web site, http://www.azpressclub.org/content/contest/contest_faq.htm

Entries must have been originally published in 2009. All entries must have been produced for the editorial department of an Arizona publication, news Web site or wire service. Work produced for advertising, marketing or other departments is not eligible.

Entries may be reported and written by a single news outlet or by more than one Arizona media outlet — i.e., two newspapers within a chain — working together. Stories partially or fully reported or written by publications or Internet sites not based in Arizona are not eligible.

CATEGORIES

Writing, design, and photojournalism categories are split into two divisions: Metro and Non-Metro.

Generally, “Non-Metro” categories are intended to honor the work of publications with fewer resources:

- any daily newspaper with a circulation of less than 20,000
- any non-daily publications with a circulation of less than 50,000, and
- online-only publications.

However, anyone who qualifies for the “Non-Metro” category is welcome to enter “Metro” instead. Experienced journalists working for online-only publications or startups are strongly encouraged to enter “Metro.”

“Best in Arizona” categories are open to all publications.

Spanish-language publications may enter any of the English-language categories, provided that all stories, headlines and captions are translated into English.

FEES

Spanish and Non-Metro publications:

\$10/person membership fee plus \$5 for each entry.

Metro publications:

\$20/person membership fee plus \$10 for each entry.

Note: If a smaller publication is distributed inside a large circulation publication, use the circulation of the larger publication in order to determine which category to enter.

Photojournalist of the Year award: \$25 plus the appropriate membership fee. The

membership fee shouldn't be paid again if the same person enters other categories in this year's contest.

Unpaid or improperly submitted entries will be disqualified and entry fees will not be refunded.

DEADLINE

Entries must be postmarked by Jan. 20, 2010, unless entrants make special arrangements in advance with contest chair Le Templar, williamtemplar@cox.net or (602) 448-5198. Entries will not be opened until the Thursday before the Jan. 30, 2010, pack-up day and only by the contest chair.

JUDGING

Entries will be judged by out-of-state journalists selected by the board of directors. Judges' decisions are final, unless winning entries do not conform to rules.

AWARDS

If there is a tie for first place, no second-place award is given. If there is a tie for second, no third-place award is given.

First place receives an award and a certificate.

Second place, third place and honorable mention receive a certificate.

Cash awards of \$100 are given only to the top winner in the following categories: Arizona Community Journalist of the Year, Arizona Designer of the Year, Arizona Photojournalist of the Year, Virg Hill Arizona Journalist of the Year.

AWARDS CEREMONY

Winners will be announced at the annual awards banquet on May 15 in Phoenix.

ETHICS AND DISQUALIFICATION

The Arizona Press Club promotes ethical journalism and recognizes that contest rules cannot envision every potential breach of professional standards. The club reserves the right to disqualify any entry or withdraw any award, based on ethical violations or violations of the rules as noted in the rules, as deemed by the board. Entries that do not conform to the rules will be disqualified. If an entry is disqualified, the prize will be awarded to the next place winner. Disqualified entrants will forfeit their entry fees.

GRIEVANCE POLICY

For problems, concerns and complaints about the contest, the contest chairperson shall notify the Grievance Committee (president and executive officers). The committee will rule on the matter or forward it to the full Press Club board for final approval.

DISCLAIMER

The Arizona Press Club is not responsible for lost, mislaid or damaged entries but will take reasonable care processing the entries.

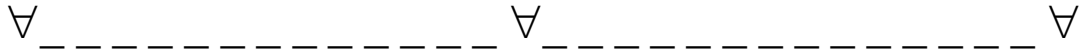
PHOTO ENTRY PROCEDURES

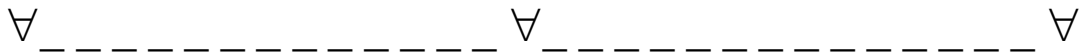

Entry Format

- 📄 Proof of publication is not required. However, entrants must provide proof if challenged.
- 🕒 Each publication's photo department will submit one (or more, if necessary) Mac-formatted CD-ROM containing all photo entries. Label each CD with your organization's name and number of disks (1 of 2, 2 of 2).
- 🖼️ Be sure that each image has all of the specified fields filled out in the File Info. The photographer will be contacted by the email or by the number given in the File Info of the photograph.
- 📖 For E5, Picture Story, no written paragraph should be provided. Make full use of the caption info to inform the judges of relevant information. Photos should drive the story but the strength of the captions may give the story an advantage.

Entering Caption and Entry Info

This year's contest is almost completely digital so specific information is required in the file info of each image. Please list carefully and correctly all information asked for so your images can be tracked back to you.

Different organizations use different kinds of programs to caption images so the basic Photoshop categories are used for the required information.

Open File info under the file menu of Photoshop.
Fill out the following fields:

Title: Write the file name here as well.

Caption: The captions should at least answer: who, what, where, when and why.

State: Where was the city located?

Credit: Photographer's name.

Source: Who you work for.

Transmission ID: Enter your email address: This is the field we are using to send you information about the contest, so make sure the address is correct.

Digital specifications and File Size Information for Images

Save each image as a RGB or grayscale file. Do not use CMYK.

Final image size of each individual picture should be 11 inches longest dimension at 250 DPI, or in pixels, 2700 longest dimension. Uncompressed RGB file size should be about 8-12 MB.

Save each file as JPEG (quality at least “7” or “good”). About 1 MB.

Naming of each digital image

Each image must have been saved in the manner specified here. Any typos in the file name may cause the images to be incorrectly sequenced or dropped from the picture story. Do not use the same title for different picture stories within the same category. Please save files listed in this order separated by a period.

The photographer’s three initials

The category code

The photo title (one word only)

For photo stories the number in the sequence they should appear in a three number form. (Example 001)

Example: DJD.E7. accident. JPG
(Photographer’s initials, category #, title, .JPG)

Folders/Single Entries

The images on the CD-ROM should be divided into separate contest category folders. For example, all photographers at a publication should put their portrait entries into one folder labeled “PORTRAITS,” all spot news entries into one folder labeled, “SPOT NEWS,” etc.

Picture Story

Photo story entries should have their own folder with all files inside together. No individual folders should be necessary for each story.

Example: DJD.E5.homeless.001.JPG
DJD.E5.homeless.002.JPG

Arizona Press Club Photographer of the Year

Open to all publications of any circulation

Entry Fee: \$25 per person

A portfolio may consist of any number of individual entries from the E classification, but no more than 40 entries, and prepared according to the general rules. Photos entered in the previous year's competition and photos republished from a prior year are not eligible. Only four entries within the portfolio can be unpublished, including one photo story. Unpublished images must be clearly labeled by writing "Unpublished" before the caption.

Portfolios must contain images representing at least five of the nine categories in the E classification, with at least one news photo (E1 or E2) and one picture story (E5). A picture story counts as one entry.

Proof of publication is not necessary, but entrants must be prepared to show proof if challenged. Unpublished images must be clearly labeled by writing "Unpublished" before the caption.

The winner will receive a \$100 check and an award vase. First runner up and second runner-up each receive an award vase.

Photographer of the Year Entries

The POY entries should have their own folder with folders inside listed with the photographer's three initials. The photographer's initials, POY, and the number in the series should label each image.

Example: DJD.POY.001.JPG
DJD.POY.002.JPG

The POY entry should be in its own folder, labeled with the photographer's three initials and filled with images named in the above manner.
